


AOVET Course – Principles in Small Animal Fracture Management

September 29 - October 1, 2017



Course description

Highly experienced faculty members from different European countries present state-of-the-art lectures on the AO principles and their application in clinical situations. 12 practical exercises serve to deepen understanding and develop manual skills. Small group discussions promote participant and faculty interaction, and concentrate on decision-making, as well as post-operative and follow-up evaluation.

Course objectives

On completion of the course, participants will be able to:

- Correctly evaluate small animal fracture patients
- Perform effective pre-operative planning
- Apply AO principles when treating long bone and articular fractures
- Act successfully when exposed to special situations like juvenile patient or open fractures
- Develop plans for post-operative care, including recognition and management of complications
- Critically assess patient outcomes

This course is suitable for beginning surgeons in small animal fracture management, as well as experienced surgeons who are looking to further develop their knowledge and skills.
